1) Turning the screws on crime – Vehicle Security

Recently there have been a number of unauthorised entries to motor vehicles within the Inner West Police District which have included the theft of number plates.

Some of these stolen number plates have been used in other criminal offences across Brisbane, such as fuel drive offs.

The fitment of the one-way security screws to registration number plates physically prevents the unlawful removal of number plates and their subsequent unlawful use in other offences.

2) Changing perspectives – Home security

There are often typical circumstances which occur prior to a home being burgled. Burglars are opportunistic; they usually act on easy or tempting opportunities, especially when it is evident no one is home or the risk of being caught is low.

What you can do:

- Ensure doors are always locked even when at home
- Ensure that all external doors (garage) are solid and fitted with quality deadlocks
- Consider fitting security screen doors, to Australian Standards
- Install a door viewer so you can see the person before you open the door
- Fit locks to your windows to Australian Standards, never leave the keys in the window lock
- Consider installing a security system which includes alarm, cameras and lighting with sensors covering all external doors, perimeter and garage
- Always ensure car keys and house keys, together with mobile phones, handbags and wallets are stored out of sight
- Ensure trees and shrubs are trimmed to allow visibility to your property and house number is clearly visible
- Lock away items of value; bikes, lawn mowers
